1315		1315 William de Cam to Richard, son of Roger de Thwaite a grant of 3 pieces of land in the field at Kirby Cane.
1316	John le Bigod held Wyndale, Gillingham, Geldeston cum Wynston, Stockton, Kirby and Ellingham.	
1320	Richard de Burghstede, rector, presented by Thomas de Brotherton Earl of Norfolk replaced the same year by John de Donewich.	
1322	 <p>Detail of the bishop's (or abbot's) crozier from the carving in Ellingham church. There may be a figure on the stem? I could find no examples of similar designs on the web.</p>	Walter de Cam sold the manor to Roger Gavel, (his son-in-law,?) who was a burges of Gt. Yarmouth. Next year (1323), Richard, second son of Walter released to Roger all his rights on condition that Roger and wife, daughter of the late de Cam, were to pay him an annuity of 20s and provide him with a new robe every winter.
1324		William Rust and his wife Felicia grant their messuage and land to William de Scordewode of Thwayt.
1326 <i>Edward III</i> <i>8 July 1307</i> <i>- 20 Jan. 1327</i>		John de Cam, rector, presented by Roger Gavel. The Gavels were a Yarmouth family.
1328		William de Merche, rector, was presented by Roger Gavel.
1330		William Toke of Raveningham to John de Thweyt and his brother Edmund, 2 plots of meadow in Ellingham
1332		Lecia le Palmere to her son John, a grant of tenements and common of pasture in Kirby Cane. Lecia Banyard of Geldeston to Lecia le Palmere, grant of a wood on her land at Kirkeby.
