<p>1591</p>	<p>Richard Wright rector, described as not having a degree and being a "preacher in his own cure." He is listed in a survey of 1608 of armour- owning clergy as owning calivers. These were fire-arms of Spanish origin 4ft 10 inches overall, which cost (inclusive of touchbox, flask, laces and mould) £13-6s-Od. He was presented by William Dix.</p>	<p>Copledike Arms</p> 
<p>1592</p>	<p>Ralph Shelton, lord of Broome manor, had married Prudence, daughter of Edward Calthorpe. He left 3 daughters and the lordship passed jointly (via the daughters or heirs) to his sons in law, William Cooke, John Croftes and Christopher Calthorpe. Apart from the fulling mill at Ditchingham, he also had lands in Ellingham.</p>	
<p>1593</p>	<p>George Norton paid an annual fine of £300. Water mill at Ellingham leased to John Hynde.</p>	<p>John Copledike interred in the cancel in a tomb chest with shield. He was succeeded by Humphrey Copledike.</p>
<p>1596</p>	<p>A new bell for the church (William and Alice Brend bell founders).</p>
