1842	Sale from the Earl of Rosebery to Lord Berners of a farm in Kirby and Ellingham and Lord Berners took on the mortgage.	
1843	<p>Rev Roger Hall died after 58 years incumbent. Rev Robert Cobb, afterwards Cartwright BA, rector, gave a stained glass east window to St. Mary's. He remained in post until his death in 1882. Church patron Lord Braybroke.</p> <p>[White's] Population 398. Annual value £2,338 <i>John Kerrich is lord of the Manor (Stockton Socun). The Hall is the seat of Col. Smith. The church patron is the Master of Magdalen College, Cambridge, the rector is Rev Robert Cobb with 120 acres of glebe. The poor have 31 acres, 2 cottage (let for £41 per annum), Poor Allotment let for £16/yr, Bonfellow's Charity £27 (with Kirby Cane) given in coals, bread and flour, blankets, tea and sugar and apprentice fees. Robert Barber (grocer), Botwright & Nunn (brickmakers), Robert Burstall (miller & coal merchant), John Gooda & Thomas Hall (butchers), William Spanton (blacksmith), Robert Smith (millwright), Publicans: James High (White Horse), Alex Gordon (The Lock House), James Ward (Bird-in-Hand).</i></p> <p><i>Farmers: William Barwick, Jarvis Boltitude, Charles Boon, Robert Chase, Antony Fisk (owner), Joseph Lynes (owner) John Palmer, Widow Petit (owner), Benjamin Read and Robert Walker.</i></p> <p>Ellingham Rectory advowson was severed from the Mastership of Magdalen College, Cambridge and sold to the Rev Wilkinson of Holbrook, T. C. Brettingham of Brockdish and W. E. Le Blane of Blackfriars London for £6,500. The purchase price appropriated to the endowment of the Mastership and invested.</p> <p>George Lincoln (of Earsham?) an employee of Robert Burtzell at Ellingham mill was arrested there for felony by Constable Earl. Having been handcuffed he eluded his captors and jumped into the river, there about 6ft deep, but despite efforts, to rescue him, was drowned.</p>	<p>[Whites] Population 458 Annual value £2,352 <i>Landowner Rt.
