1979	9th February Waveney Valley flooded. Loddon Secondary Modern School becomes a comprehensive school renamed The Hobart High School. The parishes of Ellingham, Kirby Cane, Gillingham, Geldeston and Stockton are united as the Waveney Group of Parishes. The first rector was George Ernest Odams Rapeseed became an increasingly common crop.
